Fr. Don's Doodling's

I want to fill you in on several items of news both for St. Francis Parish and elsewhere in Quincy.

First of all, we are in the process of installing a new telephone system which will serve our entire "campus." You may remember that I announced this last February as part of a Technology Enhancement for Safety and Security Project. First of all, there will be a phone in every classroom of our school building, so that all of our teachers and staff can deal with any emergency. In addition to that, there will be improved door locks, cameras and recording equipment for security in the school.

The phone system will also be an improvement to our outdated system in the Parish Office, and will provide phones in the Parish Center, which has none as yet. The projected cost of this project is \$64,500.00. A matching grant of \$22,400.00 was obtained from the Marion Gardiner Jackson Charitable Trust, and the rest came from some generous donations for which we are very grateful. The reason I'm bringing this up again is that there may be days when telephone contact with us is sketchy while the installation is in progress. Thanks for your understanding and your patience.

Next, you can see that the church is being surrounded by scaffolding as we repair the damage to the church caused by the storm of July 13, 2015. Some of us have been calling that storm a "blessing in disguise". Ever since I came here in September, 2009, we've talked about the day we will need to put a new roof on the church, and that we'd better save money to pay for it. The blessing is that the storm has provided us with that work to be paid for by insurance – every penny of the \$1,176,968.00 of it. As you know, we are getting not only a new roof, but also the replacement of the four corner piers on the clock tower and new finials on the top of those piers.

Here too I ask you to be patient with the interruptions of access to the church. The south entrance has been closed recently, and there may be times in the coming weeks when some of the main doors on 17th Street are closed. I will be in touch with the roofing workers to provide as many open doors as possible. Safety is paramount!

On to other news: A revision of the CYO is in progress. A new Board of Directors has been put in place, with two representatives from each of the parishes with schools. Kristy Obert, who is the Athletic Director of the local IESA (Illinois Elementary School Association), will be the Executive Director of the CYO. She is a very energetic and capable person, and we look forward to her providing good leadership for the CYO,

which includes sports and other activities for children who may not be involved with organized sports.

Also, we've learned that the Ladies of Charity are moving out of the store on 12th & Chestnut, and are moving into a former Dollar General Store on 24th Street. The funds generated by this store help to provide food that is given out at the store on 4th & State Street. The transition will take place over the summer months, and the former store will be sold. We look forward to the Ladies of Charity having an improved new home. I understand that they are always in need of new volunteers, so I'm sure they would welcome you to get involved.
