Fr. Don's Doodling's

As part of the Missionary Cooperation Plan of the Diocese of Springfield, we host a missionary each summer who speaks and takes up a collection for their ministry. This year we are pleased to welcome Dr. Nweze Nnakwe and her husband, Dr. Emeka Nnakwe, who represent the Merciful Hearts Foundation, Inc.

The mission of the Merciful Hearts Foundation NFP (Preventive Healthcare) is to proactively prevent malnutrition and provide healthcare services to poor pregnant women, infants and children under five years old in rural Oru South East communities in Imo State, Nigeria, Africa.

They tell us that access to healthcare services in rural communities is lacking throughout Nigeria. Every year thousands of pregnant women and their children die from preventable health conditions such as iron deficiency anemia, diarrhea, lack of prenatal care, blood loss, home childbirth (many women in rural areas still give birth at home), obstructed labor, malaria, eclampsia, placenta previa (the placenta moving near the cervical opening), and a variety of infectious diseases, including HIV infection.

We also learned the following:

- About 1 million Nigerian children under the age of 5 die each year
- 145 Nigerian women die during pregnancy or childbirth every day – it has one of the worst mortality rates in the world (UN)
- Nearly 45% of Nigerian women give birth in their homes, a percentage which is even higher in rural communities
- Lifetime risk of maternal death (2008): 1 in 23 (In industrialized countries, the lifetime risk of maternal death is 1 in 8000)
- Pre and Postnatal Care (for one woman) Costs – only \$500
- Transportation for 18 women Pre and postnatal Care Costs - \$1,600
- Blood Transfusion 3 Pints Costs - \$400

As you can see this is a very worthy mission ministry, and deserves our support. There are envelopes in the pews. If you didn't bring money to church you can bring the envelope with you next weekend with your gift. Dr. Nweze Nnakwe and her husband pay all of their own expenses, and so 100% of the funds they receive are used to directly help the women and children in Nigeria. If you would like more information about their mission and ministry, you may visit their website at www.mercifulhearts.org. Their foundation is a 501(c)3 tax exempt foundation. We wish them well, and let's keep them and all the people they serve in our prayers.

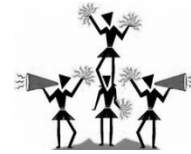

Wake up the World!

At the heart of the church is vocation. The earliest idea of what is today called "church" starts with the Greek word *ekklesia*, which is only found twice in the gospels, both times in Matthew, and means those who have been "called out." Jesus "calls out" all who follow him to share in his ministry in different ways.

Before Jesus even preached, healed someone, or performed a miracle, he called people to follow him. At the beginning of Jesus' ministry, after his baptism and temptation in the wilderness, the first thing he did was to call two sets of brothers. He asks Simon and Andrew and then James and John to follow him (Mark 1:16-20). And that is the church in its simplest terms: the followers of Jesus Christ.

The conflicts of the early Christians in Corinth are in many ways similar to our struggles today as Christians. With divisions, immorality, persecution, and other trials of the faithful, the message of St. Paul to the Corinthians is a much needed message for our own times.
