## Fr. Don's Doodling's

**Happy New Year!** And I hope and pray that the year 2017 is indeed not only happy but healthy and holy as well. And you know, we can make it all of that. Instead of thinking that it's what will happen in our world or to us that makes the year happy, let's consider the idea that it is within our power to make this a good year.

Do you make New Year's resolutions? Many who do will admit that within a few days or weeks the resolutions have gone out the window. Well I have a suggestion, and instead of calling it a New Year's resolution, let's call it a "Happiness Resolution."

If you've started reading the book "Resisting Happiness" by Matthew Kelly that we gave out, one per family, on Christmas, you'll know what I'm getting at. Matthew Kelly talks about how we often live life in such a way that we resist the very things that would bring happiness.

So, here's my suggestion for a Happiness Resolution: take more time for prayer. Yes, I know your plate is full and you just don't know where you'll squeeze in time for prayer. Well, my day is full too, often from c. 5:30 or 6:00 a.m. till 10:00 p.m. But I tell you, I don't know how I could possibly get along without prayer – daily prayer. If I can do it so can you.

Let's start with Sunday Mass. Every Sunday. Not just once or twice a month. It sets the tone for the week, and you begin feeling God being with you throughout each day. If you say you don't get anything out of the Mass, read what Matthew Kelly says about that. He's got some priceless remedies. Lots of folks make a practice of reading and praying over the Scripture readings for the coming Sunday. That kind of "primes the pump," so that you're not hearing them cold, but are ready to go deeper into the Word of God that you've already pondered.

And praying with Scripture leads to a second suggestion. Take time for daily prayer. Many of you already do this. And of course, there are more ways to pray than Carter has little liver pills. Our world has virtually exploded with creative ways of praying. You can go to the web for gobs of resources. There's the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops website, *USCCB.org*, and Loyola Press' 3-Minute Retreat, or try typing "Franciscan Prayer" and you'll find a bunch of possibilities.

But we don't have to get complicated. It's a matter of attention. Those of you who heard my homily on Christmas may remember the idea of accessibility – God made Himself totally accessible to us. That means we can choose to get in touch with God anytime, anywhere. But God can't get in touch with us if we are

totally busy and chronically distracted. We need to be accessible to God. Call it prayer, call it attentiveness, whatever. It means giving ourselves to God, and not while doing something else. Find the form of prayer that gets you deeply in touch with God, and see if you don't find the rest of your life improving greatly from this "Happiness Resolution." Again, let's make it a Happy New Year!


