Isaiah 6:1-2a,3-8; 1 Corinthians 15:1-11;
Luke 5:1-11

From all eternity, God knew you!
From all eternity, he planned to create you!
From all eternity, he called you to be perfect as he is perfect! Everyone of us has a call from God to be a saint. Everyone of us has a call from God to serve him in a way which is unique: No other human being who will ever live will ever be able to give God the specific honor and glory that you, in your uniqueness can!

Today we reflect on our individual and specific call from God. What does God want you to do with your life? To know this and to follow it is the only way you'll ever be happy in this life and in the next! The first reading of Mass tells of the call of Isaiah. The scene is the splendor of God's glory in the temple. Isaiah protests that he is a sinner; God cleanses his sin, and asks whom he will send. Isaiah answers what we must answer: "Here I am, send me!"

Paul had been a terrible persecutor of the Church. Yet God called him to conversion of heart. Paul was unworthy, but God called him to be an apostle. Paul recognizes his sinfulness, but says that God's grace can do anything . . . even make him an apostle.

The Gospel tells of the call of Peter. We can hardly imagine a less likely person to be an apostle. He had hoof in mouth disease. He was impetuous. He was dense. He was good at fishing, but little else. He asks the Lord to leave him alone, for he is a sinner. Yet Jesus calls him to be "father of men."

Reflect on your own personal call from God. Especially today reflect and pray about our need for young men to respond to Christ's call to his priesthood. Jesus Christ is calling some from this very parish to be priests. Pray that they will have the strength to answer his call. May they – and all of us – answer God's call as Isaiah did: "Here I am, send me!"

What are our excuses for not doing God's work? Lack of talent? Sinfulness? Weakness? The Lord won't allow our excuses. He forgives. He empowers. He enables us to do things beyond our natural abilities. Don't refuse him.

From Fr. Bob's Desk

As you may have observed, we have a new face at the altar – Fr. Bill Burton, O.F.M. I thought it would be good to share a bit of information about my good brother, so I did a brief interview.

So, Fr. Bill – enquiring minds want to know!

Tell us a bit about yourself...

I was a member of St. Francis parish from 1960 to 1967 and went to the grade school from 3rd to 8th grade. My Franciscan novitiate was in 1976 at St. Paschal's in Oak Brook, IL. Following initial vows, I was sent to do a doctorate in scripture in Rome in 1989 to 1994. There, I received a doctorate in Sacred Theology (STD), a Licentiate of Sacred Scripture (SSL) and a Masters of Education (MEd) from Loyola in Chicago. I then came back to Quincy University where I taught and was an administrator until 2004. Following this, I was a traveling lecturer which took me around the world delivering Biblical presentations in the Mideast, to parishes and priests' groups all over the US. Subsequent to this, I taught scripture at the St. Vincent de Paul regional seminary in Boynton Beach, Florida for seven years.

**Do you plan on being at St. Francis for a long time?*

It's hard to say, but I am certainly delighted to be here at St. Francis. It has been particularly good to inject some life into the old friary library, which has lain dormant for several years.

**Are you going to be part of the parish staff?*

I will be assisting Frs. Don and Bob with Masses, so not a part of the parish staff, *per se*. Apart from that, I will be doing research and writing. My newest book *Abba Isn't Daddy and Other Biblical Surprises* will be available in book stores March 1 and immediately on Amazon. (Thought it was OK to get in a little plug here!) Part of my work while I'm here is to work on a second book.

**We hear that you know a little something about the Bible...is it possible that we might do some kind of a Bible study during your time here? Yes! I would be happy to explore that possibility while I'm here.*

I want to thank you and Fr. Don and the parish for the warm welcome I've received and I look forward to meeting many of you.

Thanks, Fr. Bill, for this information, and we are very pleased to have you among us, for however long that might be!

We will keep you posted on plans for the picnic as they develop. Right now, members are working on details for the raffle and silent auction.

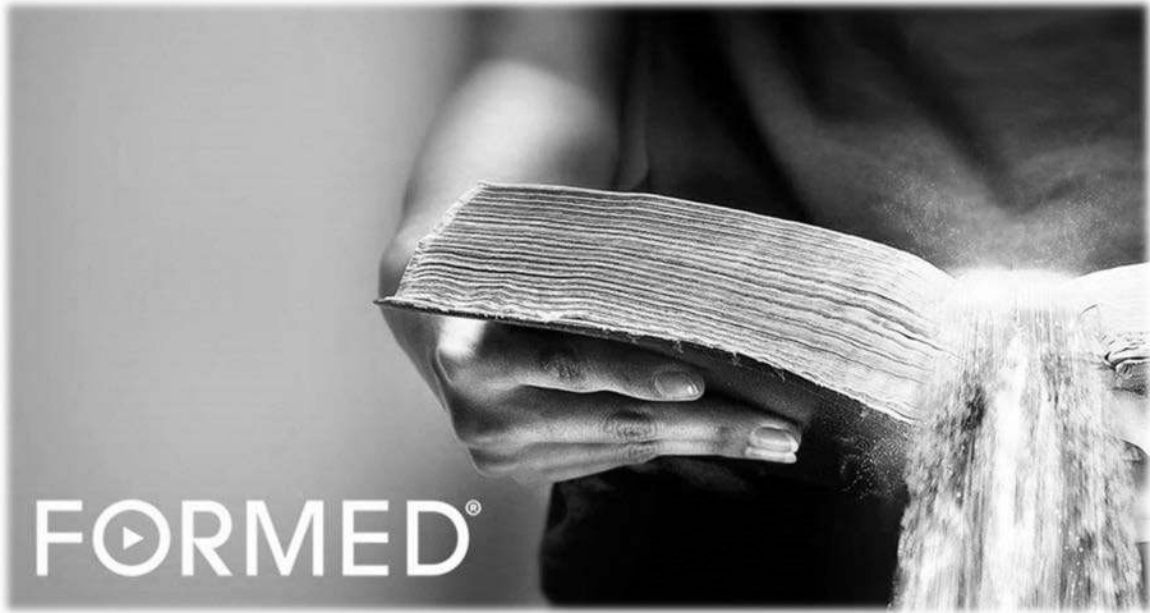
We are needing some booth chairs to help organize workers for different booths. In the future we will be at Mass with sign-up sheets for volunteers. Mark your calendars!
