## *Third Sunday of Easter*

**MAY 5, 2019**

Acts 5:27-32,40b-41; Revelation 5:11-14;  
John 21:1-19

The first reading tells us how the apostles were ordered not to speak of the name of Jesus again. They replied that they must obey God rather than people! They were flogged; then they counted it a joy to be worthy to suffer for Christ!

The second reading is taken from Revelation; this book was written to console those who were suffering persecution. Today's selection shows a scene in heaven. "The Lamb" may be identified with Jesus, who sacrificed his life for our salvation. After the ordeal of crucifixion, he is enthroned in glory. He is worthy to receive honor and glory because of his fidelity.

The thousands who surround the throne have been redeemed; they, too, are glorified because they were willing to give their lives for truth and for righteousness.

The Gospel tells of an appearance of the risen Christ in Galilee. The number 153 probably represents the entire world. (Ancient biologists enumerated a total of 153 species of fish.) Peter and the apostles are sent on a mission to "catch" the entire world for the Gospel of Christ. Peter is told that he will "stretch out his hands" (like a cross). Ancient tradition says that Peter was crucified upside down on Vatican hill in Rome.

The message of today's Mass, then, is that we must be loyal to truth and to virtue, even if it costs us dearly. Our loyalty must not be selective. It must be a loyalty to every aspect of the message of Jesus Christ.

For example, if we are opposed to the violence of abortion, we must also be opposed to violence in destroying property or in wounding or killing of any human being. If we are opposed to violence, we must control our tempers and our rhetoric.

## HOLINESS IS POSSIBLE

From Fr. Bob's Desk...

Do you remember Matthew Kelly teaching us about – Holy Moments?

How's it going?

He says, "If you can create just one holy moment next Monday, you can create two on Tuesday and four on Wednesday, eight on Thursday, and so on. There is no limit to the number of holy moments you can create, other than your desire and the consciousness to grasp each moment for God as it is unfolding.

Now, it is important to note that you need God's grace to create holy moments. He will never deny you the grace you need. It is never God's grace that is lacking, but rather our willingness to cooperate with his grace."

Here are some examples of holy moments:

**Begin each day** with a short prayer of gratitude, thanking God for giving you another day of life. This prayer can be short and simple. But turning to God in the first moment of the day is a great way to start and a fabulous way to set the stage for other holy moments throughout the day.

**Offer the least enjoyable tasks** of your day to God as a prayer for someone who is suffering. This person's suffering could be physical, but suffering comes in an infinite number of disguises. You may know someone who is miserable at work, you may know someone who is struggling in his or her marriage, you may know someone who has an addiction. Offer your suffering for those people just as Jesus offered his suffering on the cross for us.

**Control your temper.**

**Patiently coach** someone who doesn't know how to do something or did something wrong.

**Go out of your way** to do something for your spouse that you would rather not do, as an intentional act of love.

**Do something** that will help the world! For instance, The Franciscans of Sacred Heart Province are raising funds to dig wells in the Democratic Republic of Congo--a country, which, like many African countries, is experiencing a terrible shortage of safe drinking water. Our first well was completed in February 2017 in the village of Mulenga. Previously, the women and girls of the village had to walk 3.7 miles to find water for their families. Three additional wells have been completed; two more water projects have been funded and will begin in March 2018. Can any of us imagine having to get our daily water in this way?

This is what holiness looks like!

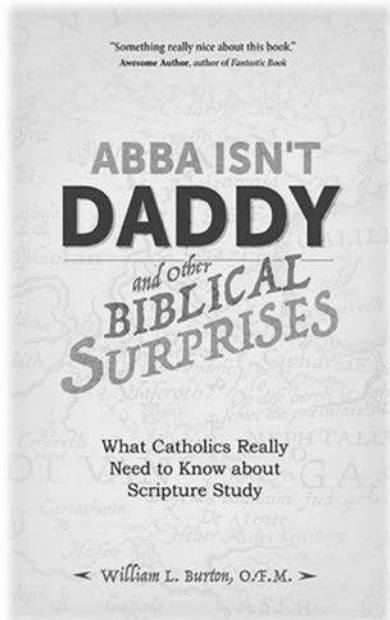
