Times change. Personnel come and go. We pass from one phase of life to another. This weekend, many will graduate from college; they will then go on to something new in life. This summer, many priests will receive changes of assignment; both priests and people must adjust.

Today's first reading describes a change in the Churches of Asia Minor. Paul is going to leave; they probably won't see him again. He ordains priests there, and commends them to God's care.

We can't hang on to the old forever. Parents must let go of their children. Teachers must let go of their students. We must all have faith and hope that God will always be with us.

The second reading tells of another change: John sees a new heaven and a new earth. The old had passed away. There might be nostalgia for the old and the comfortable, but the new will be better. We of the older generation must trust that the younger generation will have wisdom and insight and divine guidance as they face a new world.

The Gospel selection is Jesus' last instructions to his disciples. The big change would happen soon: He would return to his Father through his death, resurrection, and ascension. Before he leaves, he gives us a new commandment. The new commandment is the moral imperative of every Christian. We are called to love each other as Christ Jesus has loved us!

With the power of God's spirit, let us always strive to do this. Then each day will be new and vibrant. Then we shall have peace of soul even in crisis and adversity. Then we shall see that God is with us, and that all will be well.

5th Sunday of Easter

May 19, 2019

Fr. Don's Doodlings

Since we are still in this beautiful Easter Season, it's the perfect time to say a few words about the Mass. Why? Because every time we celebrate the Mass, we are celebrating Christ's resurrection. And that is even more strongly the case with our Sunday celebrations.

Some of the prayers of the Mass make this abundantly clear. For example Eucharistic Prayer III, immediately after the words of institution and acclamation, says: *"Therefore, O Lord, as we celebrate the memorial of the saving Passion of your Son, his wondrous Resurrection and Ascension into heaven, and as we look forward to his second coming, we offer you in thanksgiving this holy and living sacrifice."*

In fact, all of the Eucharistic Prayers say this with a variety of wordings. And at the conclusion of the Eucharistic Prayer the congregation responds with the word, *"Amen."* That comes right after the priest says, *"Through him and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, for ever and ever."* In effect, the priest is summarizing all that has been said in the Eucharistic Prayer – all that the Mass is celebrating, all that we believe Christ has done for us, all that is made present to us of Christ's Paschal Mystery. For that reason, the *"Amen"* is often referred to as the *"Great Amen."*

This calls for the congregation to respond with great enthusiasm. That little word is the way for the faithful to say, *"I am overjoyed to hear this and I want to make all of it my own."* *"Yes!" "Definitely!" "I agree, and praise and thank you, O God, with all my heart."* Perhaps that little word, *"Amen"* is indeed too little, too short. Maybe it catches us off-guard, and is over before we are aware of it coming. Which is why it is best sung, and when sung, it's usually repeated several times, in order to bring out the importance of it, to relish it, to savor it. With this one little word we are adding our faith-filled affirmation to the whole celebration.

You can see, then, how important it is for everyone to respond. And that goes for all the responses in the celebration of the Mass. It's amazing what happens when a congregation does respond with enthusiasm. It's electric! By comparison, we know what happens at sporting events when people are cheering wildly. It's even called *"home team advantage"* because many times it can even have an effect on the outcome of a game.

I would love to have *"home team advantage"* at each and every Mass that we celebrate. We should have far more enthusiasm in church than we have for a sports team. When you think of the awesome mystery of Christ's Resurrection that we are celebrating, and the fantastic promise of eternal life with Christ that we look forward to, it should really make us stand up and cheer. Which, in a way, is what we're doing by making all the responses and praying all the prayers that are the role of participation for the congregation.

If you tend toward being silent, you can begin by responding with a strong, faith-filled *"Amen,"* when the minister says, *"The Body of Christ,"* and *"The Blood of Christ."* Also, please pick up a hymnal and sing, or a missalette or prayer card and lend your voice to the celebration. I can guarantee that if you do so, and do so regularly, you will find that you get more out of the Mass. It just follows that if you invest yourself in this awesome celebration, you will find it more meaningful and rewarding.

Pope St. John Paul II, wrote in *Ecclesia de Eucharistia*: *"The Eucharist is truly a glimpse of heaven appearing on earth. It is a glorious ray of the heavenly Jerusalem which pierces the clouds of our history and lights up our journey."* (#19)


