Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

JUNE 16, 2019

Proverbs 8:22-31; Romans 5:1-5;
John 16:12-15

From all eternity, there is only one God. From all eternity, there are Three Persons in this one God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. As far as their attributes, whatever can be said of the Father, can also be said of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

The Father is eternal, almighty, infinite in perfection; so also is the Son; so also is the Holy Spirit. But there are not three "almighties" or three "eternals," but only one almighty, eternal God infinite in perfection. The Father is not the Son is not the Holy Spirit. They are distinct Persons who share and completely possess the one nature of God.

From all eternity, the Father begets the Son; from all eternity, the Son is born of the Father. From all eternity, the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son. (The Oriental Churches express this as "from the Father through the Son.")

In time, about 7 B.C., only the Son became incarnate: The Word was made flesh. The Second Person of the Trinity became fully man without ceasing to be God. Jesus Christ is equal to the Father in his divinity, but less than the Father in his humanity: But he is One Person, ever to be adored in his majesty.

All of this is very heady theology! In fact, absolutely nothing is known of the Trinity in the Old Testament. Only Jesus reveals to us this central mystery of our faith. He revealed it as the practical basis of our spiritual life.

The Father loves us with an everlasting love; yet, in the Old Testament, he seems clouded in unapproachable light. We can scarcely visualize him as a Person. He seems so far above us.

The Eternal Son of God became man to show us the Father. When we see Jesus, we see the love of the Father. He is one of us. He is our access to the Father, our Mediator, our Savior. He assures us of the Father's forgiveness. He is the model of what God intended us to be. He gave his life for us. In him, we can have confidence in approaching the Father.

But we no longer see Jesus; he has returned to the glory of the Father. He has not left us orphans, however. He has sent the Holy Spirit, the "Paraclete." "Paraclete" means "one who stands by." He stands by us as our advocate, as our defense attorney against all the trials of this earth. He stands by us to comfort us and strengthen us. He stands by us to make us one in Christ Jesus. He manifests the Son to us, just as the Son manifested the Father.

In the Holy Spirit, we are joined with Mary and all the saints in Christ. Our spiritual life, then, must be rooted in the mystery of the Trinity. We give glory TO the Father, THROUGH the Son, IN the Holy Spirit, WITH the Blessed Virgin Mary and all the saints! Let us live and pray as we profess to believe.

Great job, folks!

And of course, a huge thank you goes to all of you who worked in booths, those who served food and beverages, those who ran games for the children, and others who ran the adult games, and those who gave their bodies to the insult of getting dunked in the dunk tank. I know there must be a thousand others who should be thanked. Please know that we appreciate what all of you have done to make this picnic so enjoyable.

This was stewardship in action. The picnic would not have been possible for only a few individuals to accomplish, but only with the united effort of everyone. And while the money that the picnic generates is important, I personally consider that the wonderful feeling of unity and enjoyment as a parish community is an even greater value. I was able to connect with a number of people and had conversations that might never have happened elsewhere. It was all an example of what Fr. Larry Tucker, our missionary preacher on Pentecost Sunday, spoke of as allowing the Holy Spirit to lead the way, and we simply follow, we respond. So thanks again to all of you, who worked at the picnic, all who came to enjoy the evening, and thanks to our dear Lord for blessing us with all that we have and all that we are.

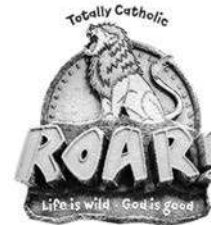

Fr. Augustus Tolton Procession

Area Catholics and others devoted to the Venerable Fr. Augustus Tolton will commemorate the 122nd anniversary of his death with a pilgrimage procession on Saturday, July 6. Fr. Tolton died in Chicago on July 9, 1897 and is interred in St. Peter Cemetery in Quincy, where he was raised and from where he left to study for the priesthood in Rome. He returned to Quincy as a priest in 1886 and ministered in the Gem City until he left for Chicago in 1889. The Cause for the canonization of Fr. Tolton is underway.

The mile-long pilgrimage procession will begin at 9:00 a.m. at the statue of Fr. Tolton outside St. Peter Catholic School at 2500 Maine Street. After a few words of welcome and explanation, followed by a prayer, the pilgrimage procession will process along the south side of Maine Street where it will cross onto the east side of South 33rd Street. It will then process along the east side of South 33rd Street until it reaches St. Peter Catholic Cemetery.

After entering the cemetery, the procession will stop at the grave of Fr. Tolton for the celebration of Morning Prayer at 9:30 a.m., which is composed of Psalms, a reading from Scripture, petitions, and song. After Morning Prayer, the pilgrims will pray for more priests through Fr. Tolton's intercession and for his canonization as a saint. The pilgrimage procession will conclude with the singing of "Holy God, We Praise Thy Name," Fr. Tolton's favorite song.

Those who wish to participate in the Morning Prayer but cannot walk in the procession are invited to park near the cemetery to meet the procession at the grave; because of the small size of the cemetery, no one should park in the cemetery itself. Chairs and bottled water will be provided at the cemetery for those who wish to participate in the Morning Prayer.

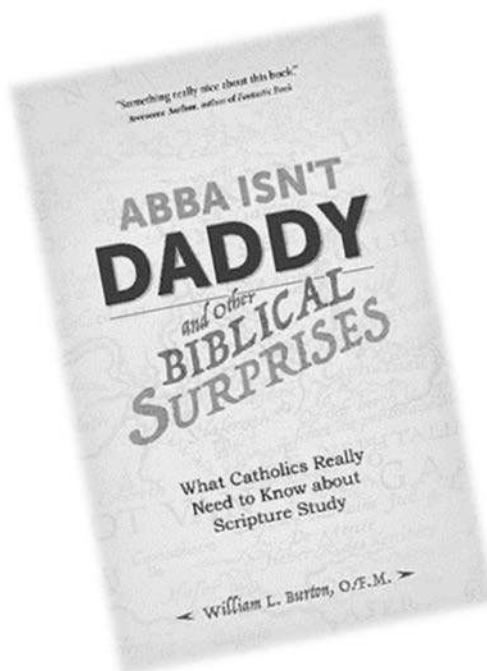

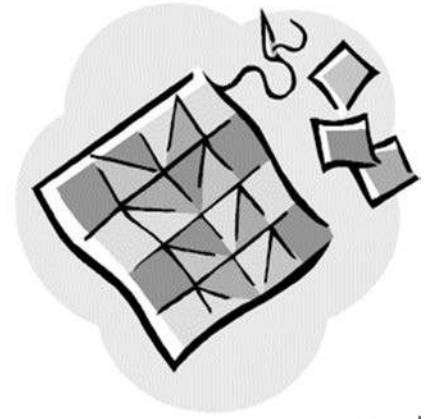

Thank You Quilters!

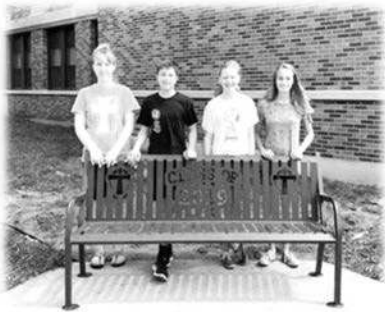
