Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ

JUNE 23, 2019

Genesis 14:18-20; 1 Corinthians 11:23-26;
Luke 9:11b-17

Corpus Christi is more than a city in Texas. The words mean "Body of Christ." Today we celebrate the Mystery of the Holy Eucharist. It is the mystery by which Jesus Christ is truly present under appearances of bread and wine. It is the mystery by which Jesus Christ, under these forms, renews the offering of himself to our heavenly Father. The Mass is a renewal of the sacrifice of Christ on the cross, and of his entire saving life. The Eucharist is also the mystery by which the Lord Jesus Christ comes to us under appearances of bread and wine to be nourishment for our spiritual life.

Our first reading is the conclusion of a very strange story in Genesis. Abraham and his coalition had just defeated another coalition of tribes. Melchizedek is a pagan priest from Salem (or Jerusalem – still a pagan city). Melchizedek blessed Abraham by his gods. Abraham replied that he owed his allegiance only to Yahweh, who was God almighty and Creator.

The story, however, is less important than the symbolism. Melchizedek, in later Jewish tradition (Psalm 110) became a "type" or "symbol" of the eternal priesthood. Jewish priests had to be descended from Aaron; they were born and they died. But Melchizedek just "appears" and "disappears." Thus he symbolized priesthood without beginning or end. This is the priesthood of Jesus Christ, which is shown in the Eucharist.

The second reading is the oldest Biblical account of the institution of the Eucharist. It was written in 58 A.D., but Paul took it from the actually celebrated liturgy! The word "remembrance" (sometimes translated "memory") actually means *memorial sacrifice*. The word was used in the Old Testament for sacrifices which called upon God to remember his mercies. (It is not *our* remembering, but *God's* remembering!)

The most important *memorial sacrifice* of the Jews was Passover. The Eucharist is our Christian Passover by which God remembers to deliver us and to save us and to show us mercy. The word *proclaim* means to *bring to the present and make effective and actual*. As often as we celebrate the Eucharist, we bring to the present and make effective the salvation of Christ. *Covenant* means that we have a bargain to keep. Our part of the bargain is to do all that Christ wants of us, to live as he wants us to live.

The Gospel helps us to accept this Mystery. If Jesus could multiply loaves and fishes to feed 5,000 people, then he has the power to change bread and wine into his Body and Blood. He also has the power to be present under these forms in every Mass throughout the world.

Let us renew our appreciation of the Mystery of the Holy Eucharist.

I'm sure you've all heard the wonderful news that on June 12 Fr. Augustus Tolton was declared "Venerable" by Pope Francis. This means he is officially recognized by the Catholic Church as having lived a life of heroic virtue. As Bishop Paprocki put it, "Today's news is not only exciting for Catholics across the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois, but also for the entire Christian world." And I would add that it is especially exciting news for all of us here in Quincy.

Augustus (or Augustine) was born in 1854 in Brush Creek, Missouri, where his family were slaves. One of three children born to Martha Jane and Peter Paul Tolton, "Gus" was raised in the Catholic Faith. In the height of the national controversy over slavery, Peter Paul ran away to fight with the Union forces. Martha Jane had no way of knowing that some time later Peter Paul had died of dysentery in a St. Louis hospital shortly after he had run away.

Finally, Martha Jane decided to run away from Missouri together with her three children to freedom in Illinois. She made her way to Hannibal, and from there, partly with the help of some Union soldiers, was able to get in a boat with her children, Charles, Augustus and Anne, and row across the Mississippi. On their way across, Confederates spotted them and began shouting threats and even shooting at them. As it was night, the bullets all missed them and they got across safely to Illinois, and finally made their way to Quincy, which was Martha Jane's plan.

Martha Jane wanted her children to have an education, and she enrolled Augustus in St. Boniface School. Even though Illinois was a free state, the boy experienced vicious bigotry. Parents threatened to withdraw their children from the school, and someone even threw a rock through the window of the rectory. The pastor felt badly, but it was mutually agreed upon to have Augustus withdraw from the school. Augustus was accepted in St. Francis College (now Quincy University).

The Franciscan friars, among others, encouraged Gus to consider having a vocation to the priesthood. After being refused admission by every seminary in the U.S. because of his race, the Franciscans helped him to be accepted by the Seminary of the Propagation of the Faith in Rome. He was ordained a priest on Holy Saturday, April 24, 1886, in St. John Lateran in Rome, "The Head and Mother Church of the Whole World."



Expecting to be sent to Africa to minister there, Fr. Augustus was instead sent back to the U.S. with the remark that he was needed there. The new priest was greeted warmly when he arrived in Quincy, but soon the devastating reality of prejudice again reared its ugly head. After ministry in St. Joseph Church on 7th and Jersey, for about three years, Fr. Gus was transferred to Chicago, where he ministered to a congregation of Black Catholics. Father Gus died from heat stroke in 1897 at the age of 43.

Now that Father Tolton has been declared Venerable, the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois is exploring having a shrine to honor him. One possible location could be the now closed St. Boniface Church in Quincy. An announcement on that could come later this year.

If a miracle can be attributed to Father Tolton's prayerful intercession, he could then be declared Blessed by the Pope. Another miracle would lead him to sainthood. Officials in Rome are currently reviewing at least one possible miracle. So, it is up to us to pray to Fr. Gus, asking him to intercede for any worthy cause. And we are now welcome to look to him as a good example of how to live a worthy Christian life even in the midst of suffering. Venerable Fr. Gus, pray for us.

Fr. Augustus Tolton Procession

Area Catholics and others devoted to the Venerable Fr. Augustus Tolton will commemorate the 122nd anniversary of his death with a pilgrimage procession on Saturday, July 6. Fr. Tolton died in Chicago on July 9, 1897 and is interred in St. Peter Cemetery in Quincy, where he was raised and from where he left to study for the priesthood in Rome. He returned to Quincy as a priest in 1886 and ministered in the Gem City until he left for Chicago in 1889. The Cause for the canonization of Fr. Tolton is underway.

The mile-long pilgrimage procession will begin at 9:00 a.m. at the statue of Fr. Tolton outside St. Peter Catholic School at 2500 Maine Street. After a few words of welcome and explanation, followed by a prayer, the pilgrimage procession will process along the south side of Maine Street where it will cross onto the east side of South 33rd Street. It will then process along the east side of South 33rd Street until it reaches St. Peter Catholic Cemetery.

After entering the cemetery, the procession will stop at the grave of Fr. Tolton for the celebration of Morning Prayer at 9:30 a.m., which is composed of Psalms, a reading from Scripture, petitions, and song. After Morning Prayer, the pilgrims will pray for more priests through Fr. Tolton's intercession and for his canonization as a saint. The pilgrimage procession will conclude with the singing of "Holy God, We Praise Thy Name," Fr. Tolton's favorite song.

Those who wish to participate in the Morning Prayer but cannot walk in the procession are invited to park near the cemetery to meet the procession at the grave; because of the small size of the cemetery, no one should park in the cemetery itself.

Chairs and bottled water will be provided at the cemetery for those who wish to participate in the Morning Prayer.

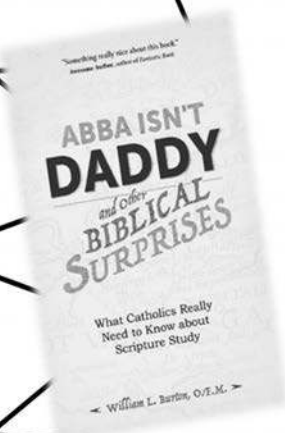
