Ecclesiastes 1:2;2:21-23;
Colossians 3:1-5,9-11;
Luke 12:13-21

Wisdom means putting everything in its proper place in relation to our purpose in life. The old Baltimore catechism stated our purpose in a few words: "To know, love, and serve God so as to be happy with him in this life and in the next." We were created for God. True wisdom is to seek God and to serve him with all our heart. If we have any goal contrary to this goal, we shall not be happy and we shall not be wise.

But our full goal of eternal happiness was not known in ancient times. The author of Ecclesiastes knew that no earthly pleasure or possession could satisfy us. He knew that God was the answer, but he still knew nothing of heaven. For this reason he begins and ends his book with a rather despairing cry: "Vanity of vanities, and all is vanity!" You work hard, and for what? You will die and leave your wealth to others.

The man in the Gospel is likewise foolish. He lived only for this world. When he had a tremendous harvest, he decided to build bigger barns and to enjoy himself. Jesus calls him a fool, for he would die that very night.

For what do we work? What is our purpose in life? Do we really live as we say we believe? Do we try each day to love and serve the Lord? Do we live each day as if it is to be our last on earth? If so, we shall have peace. If not, we shall probably be miserable.

Our second reading fits in with this theme: Set your hearts on higher things. You have been baptized into Christ. You live his life. You have died to sin, so don't return to it. Put to death anything which would keep you away from God. You are a new person, a new creation in Christ: Live as one!

From the Desk of the D.R.E.

Warner Sallman was a painter. You may not recognize his name, but I bet you might recognize some of his paintings. The one that stands out most in my mind is the one where Jesus is standing outside an old medieval home, knocking on a door with no handle or door knob. Susie and I received a print of that painting as a wedding gift and it hung on our walls for a long time. Of course the message Sallman was conveying in his painting was quite clear, Jesus is always asking to enter our hearts, but it's up to us to let Him in.

I often wondered what Jesus would do if we opened the door and said: "You are welcome to come in, but not just yet....could you come back at a later date, like next September? We'll be much better prepared for you then." Hmm....that makes me wonder.... How would Jesus perceive that welcome? With hospitality or disappointment?

I've been involved with the RCIA in the Quincy Deanery since the 1980's. RCIA is short for Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. The RCIA is the process by which new members are welcomed, catechized and brought into full communion with the Catholic Church. For many years we followed a scholastic model where the RCIA would begin in September and end in May. Much the same as the school year. So....if someone came a knocking on our church door or called us after May, we would say, "Wonderful, thanks for your interest! Come back and see us in September when next year's class starts." Although the Rite itself suggests a different approach, this is how some, if not most, of the parishes in our diocese and others, have run the RCIA.

Not anymore! Enter what is called the "Year-Round Catechumenate". No longer will we have to tell an inquirer that we can't open our door to him or her and make them wait. The RCIA team is working on implementing a 12 month process that will, when in place, go on and on, devoid of a beginning or end.

How will our RCIA team pull this off without complete and total burn-out you may ask? This is where you come in! Even if you haven't cracked open a catechism since high-school, you can be the leaven by which the catechumens grow in faith. We will need a few good people willing to help facilitate "Dismissal" during the Sunday Masses. During "Dismissal" we "break open" the Word of God spoken to us in the Sunday readings. This normally takes place in our Parish Center right after the homily.

If you think you couldn't possibly be on the RCIA team, just remember this, God doesn't call the qualified, he qualifies the Called. So if you receive a call from someone on the RCIA team to help with the Year-Round Catechumenate, please be open to the possibilities and pray about it before answering! Is Jesus knocking?
