Amos 8:4-7; 1 Timothy 2:1-8;
Luke 16:1-13

Amos was a contemporary of Isaiah, Hosea, and Micah in the Eighth Century before Christ. He was a country boy from the south (Judah) who was called by God to preach to the wealthy and sophisticated north (Israel). He condemns Israel for its materialism.

The people had become attached to money and what it would buy. They did not like the "interruption" of the Lord's Day or Sabbath, for they wanted to get back to the business of making money. They cheated by adjusting their weights and measures. They cared nothing for the less fortunate. Amos warns them that God does not forget.

Very likely, the "Pastoral Epistles" (1-2 Timothy and Titus) were not written by Paul. They may have been written by a third or fourth generation Christian who realized that Christ would probably not come in glory very soon.

The message is that the Church must learn to live in this world. Even though the Roman government was alien to Christianity, the author urges that prayers be offered for all in authority.

The longer form of the Gospel tells of a corrupt business manager who is about to be fired. He gives kick-backs to his master's creditors so that they will take care of him after he is fired! Jesus laments that the people of "this world" are far more zealous in seeking their goals than Christians are. He tells us that we cannot serve two masters.

We have been entrusted with the riches of heaven. How sad it is that we are more concerned about the puny wealth of this world. If we don't use this world's goods for the glory of God, how can we be entrusted with the riches of eternity?

Fr. Don's Doodlings

Why should I contribute to the Annual Catholic Services Appeal? Good question! Let's begin by remembering who we are. We are Roman Catholics, which means that we are members of a world-wide Church, with headquarters in Rome and with local representation in the Diocese of Springfield, Illinois. I, for one, am happy that we are not an independent church making up our own theology, and without solid roots. It goes back to Christ, who said to Peter, "You are Peter and upon this Rock I will build my Church." So, we are a family, and if you appreciate it as I do, you are grateful.

Additional answers to the question all rest on that first one, namely, that any organization, family, church, needs money to survive. The diocese has many employees who perform ministries, serving all of us. In my copy of the Diocesan Pastoral Directory I count over 60 people with phone extension and an email address. I find myself contacting these people frequently, with questions, problems, information.

A good example is the Marriage Tribunal, which serves us in dealing with marriages that are scheduled here at St. Francis, and also with helping people to procure annulments. This is essential to the life of parishes and something that cannot be handled on the local level without assistance. Likewise, there are offices that assist us in helping couples prepare for marriage, and that help us in our ministries with converts to the Faith (RCIA), with youth, with liturgy, and the list goes on.

The Finance Office is also a huge source of assistance to us, as well as the Insurance Office. Thank God for our insurance with the diocese, which paid for our \$1¼ Million worth of repairs on our church from the July 13, 2015, wind storm!

Every time we have another parishioner who wants to be a Communion Minister, I contact the office of the Vicar General to get the person mandated for this ministry. In fact, that's a good example because those who are Communion Ministers are doing a ministry that is otherwise only done by an ordained priest or deacon, which is why these folks need to be mandated by the bishop, through the Vicar General.

All of this is only a small sample of the many services and ministries that are performed by the diocese. The bottom line is that the parish is obligated to pay its assessment every year, which is based on our income. The formula is somewhat complicated, but is basically 11.5% of the income of the previous fiscal year. Well our income last year must have been quite good, because our assessment for this year is \$111,523.

All of this, of course, is part of practicing stewardship, and giving out of gratitude to God for all our blessings. So, when you get your mailing from the diocese in the next few days, please ask the Lord to help you decide what you should give this year. I pray that you will be generous.
