Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

JANUARY 19, 2020

Isaiah 49:3,5-6; 1 Corinthians 1:1-3;
John 1:29-34

We return to “Ordinary Time.” This is not a very happy expression; a better name would be “The Season of the Church.” During this season, we reflect on the meaning of Church.

Who are we as a people? The liturgical color is green, the color of hope and of life. Our second reading tells us that we are called to be a holy people. Holiness means that we answer promptly to the Lord's invitation.

Our Responsorial Psalm refrain must be our ready response: “Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will.” Jesus came to do the will of his Father. He is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. He is anointed by the Spirit. He is God's Chosen One.

Our first reading is from the second (of four) “Suffering Servant Songs” in Isaiah. These songs tell of a person who takes all grief and sin to himself, and by his suffering, he vicariously heals all.

As Christians, we share in the mission of Christ. We have been anointed with his Spirit (in Confirmation). We are called to change this world. As the second reading tells us, we have been consecrated in Christ Jesus, and called to be a holy people.

Like John, in the Gospel, we may not always recognize Christ in our world. Yet we must pray for faith always to see him in every person and in every situation. Let us pray that we shall be loyal to Christ in seeking to eliminate sin and to bring virtue to our world.

Thank You

A big thank you to all who helped to take down the Christmas decorations. They were so beautiful that it's sad to see them go, so thanks also to those who put them up.

Have you made any New Year's resolutions? Do you ever? Don't you ever? Well, even if you have never made a New Year's resolution, I have one for you that I strongly encourage you to make. Simply stated it's this: Make the practice of stewardship a priority in 2020!

We recently did the renewal of our commitment to practicing stewardship, and many of you signed up to get involved in all kinds of wonderful ways. I want to simply be like a coach and encourage you to follow through. Don't slack off. Do what you resolved to do.

And for those who did not fill out a commitment card, and are not on board with practicing stewardship, I want to also be like a coach and say, it's time to get off the bench and get in the game. It's good for the parish and also for us individually.

By this time most of you are well aware that stewardship is a way of life. It is nothing more and nothing less than practicing discipleship, putting our faith in action. Monsignor Thomas McGread, who initiated stewardship in a little parish in Wichita, KS, in the 1960s called the Bible "the textbook of stewardship." In other words, it's in the Sacred Scriptures, growing in our spiritual life, not a recent gimmick. The result is that the Diocese of Wichita, KS, is vibrant, it's on fire with people who practice their faith, with around 85% of Catholics attending Sunday Mass. They have had so many vocations to the priesthood that there is no priest-shortage in the diocese, and the average age of priests is much younger than we see elsewhere.

There's nothing complicated, nothing tricky about this, dear friends. It's not a matter of learning a new language or acquiring a new skill. However, it may be a matter of changing a mindset. For example, do I wonder: "how much do I have to do?" or "how little can I get by with doing?" Why not end that kind of mindset?

A couple of examples: the Mass calls for participation, so instead of "Do I have to sing?" start thinking, "I want to contribute to the prayerful celebration." No problem, just pick up a hymnal and sing the songs...including those who "can't sing." Start to respond to the prayers and acclamations, "Amen," "And with your spirit," "We lift them up to the Lord," "It is right and just" – and do so wholeheartedly. Also, how about staying for the entire Mass, and not leaving after receiving Holy Communion? Last Sunday, at 8:00 and 11:00 a.m. Masses we had the Enrollment of the 3rd Graders for Confirmation in the spring, and we prayed that we might give them good example by the way we are committed to practicing our faith. I hope that they don't decide to imitate the example of leaving Mass early. Again, "How much do I have to do?" may be lurking in the back of our minds.

There is also the expectation that those who are involved in all kinds of church ministries and organizations will take care of everything. Let's change that mindset, and get involved by trying something new, or just giving yourself more energetically to a ministry you are currently involved in? Personally, I'm going to try to be more faithful in getting into the classrooms in our school, and to make more hospital visits.

We can all do something to put stewardship high in our list of priorities. Like I say, it may be as simple as saying or singing "Amen," and doing so like we really mean it. So, as we launch into 2020, let's see if we can make St. Francis Parish be a model of practicing stewardship as a way of life.
