From Fr. Bob's Desk...

So, how's everybody doing?

As I was wondering what to write about this week, what was stirring in my mind is to 'check in' with everybody. Hopefully, some of these questions might stir something inside you to help, or maybe motivate you to attend to something that you may have let slide a bit....

We're all stressed out about staying home – are you making life easier or more difficult for those with whom you live? That's for you kids, too!!

Are we attending to our prayer life? We certainly have more time on our hands to do so, right? What about trying something new? Praying the Rosary? Centering Prayer? Meditation? I saw a meme recently on Facebook that was very apropos. It said, "God sometimes I just don't have words, and I'm so happy you can read my heart!" This is important to know – God doesn't rely on our eloquence or manner of speech... He relies on our hearts – nothing more.

For you married couples – are you remembering that your relationship is primary? Sometimes, as couples age, they forget that their husband or wife is their number one priority – not their kids, grandkids or parents – but each other. And for you newlyweds or "medium" weds – this is a good reminder for you too! From that primary, marital relationship, the strength to honor all those other relationships will spring forth!

Are you attending to your own mental health? Depression, sadness, moodiness, addiction are all out there waiting to get their "thin edge of the wedge" into your own mind and body. Be aware of the signs! Call for help if you need to or want to! Expressing in words, out loud, is a very healing thing – and sometimes we just try to keep it all in...and that rarely does anybody any good. Getting those feelings out of your body through words is a marvelous way to be in touch with your own good mental health. You might discover that you need a little 'extra' help.

What about the Eucharist? We know that this "fast" from the Eucharist is painful for you – it is likewise painful for us. Years ago, I travelled to Lourdes, France, on pilgrimage. While attending mass in the Piux X Chapel, there were thousands in attendance – very remarkable. When communion time happened, it was like a stampede! I inquired afterward why the people were so brazenly rushing, bumping and pushing to get to communion? The response was, "because in most parts of the world, people receive communion but once a year, because of the priest shortage." So, offering a bit of our "fast" for the solidarity with these people, I think would be a timely practice just now.

Know that as we transition as a parish, you are all kept very close in loving prayer.

2. While our office is closed, please maximize your use of ShopWithScrip.com instant ecards and reloads paying with PrestoPay. If you're not yet enrolled in ShopWithScrip.com, please find on our website, the **how-to article** on enrolling. We are monitoring our email and will send you the enrollment code as soon as we see your email.
3. If you have any GGF local merchant bills that you want to pay, just put the invoice and check (payable to the Gene Grawe Fund) in an envelope and slide it under our office door in the lobby of St Peter's Church. The church is open during the day.
4. The 2020-2021 School Year Scholarship Awards announcement event previously scheduled for this coming Tuesday has been canceled. Instead, we will be emailing parents their student's tuition award amount next week. Please be patient as it will take us a few days to get them all sent out.
