Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ

JUNE 14, 2020

Deuteronomy 8:2-3,14b-16a;
1 Corinthians 10:16-17; John 6:51-58

Today's feast is usually known by its Latin title "Corpus Christi." We firmly believe that, at the consecration of Mass, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of the risen Lord Jesus Christ. In Communion, then, we do not receive bread and wine; we receive the glorified Christ under the appearances of bread and wine.

After the consecration, nothing of the bread or wine remains except the "accidental appearances" such as taste, size, texture, etc. The reality is the risen Lord!

But we can receive the Body and Blood of Christ every day without any benefit unless we give ourselves to Christ. We must live by his word if his sacrament is to be of any benefit to us. This is the message of today's Mass.

The first reading tells of Moses' last instructions to the Israelites. He reminds them that they were all fed by manna, a miraculous food. But the manna did not save them unless they lived by the word of the Lord. Through the centuries, rabbis began to speak of the "bread of life" as the "Torah" or God's holy word. Whoever "ate the bread" of the Torah would live forever.

In the Gospel, Jesus says that he, not the Torah, is the bread of life. He replaces the Torah; we must live by his word. Then, astoundingly, he states that the new manna that he will give will be his flesh!

The Eucharist, then, is the sign that we give ourselves totally and completely to keep the word of Christ. Whoever lives according to his word will richly profit from the Eucharist.

The second reading reminds us of the social implications of the Eucharist. If you and you and you and I are united with the same Eucharistic Lord, then we must be united with each other. We, though many, become one Body of Christ. Therefore we must carry each other's burdens and share each other's sorrows.

From Fr. Bob's Desk...

In thinking about this week's article, I couldn't help but consider what's been happening in the world these past days, with regard to the police, George Floyd and racism in general. It's a word that we uncomfortably toss about and try not to think about ... much. My daughter Katie has been speaking to me quite a bit lately, and from a young adult perspective. I'm very proud of the way she takes this very seriously. She is a professor at Illinois State University, and the subject of racism is regularly in her prevue.

Last week, she asked me, "What's the opposite of racism, dad?" I considered it for a moment, and replied, "Unconditional love, of course!" She said... "Oh dad, I knew you would say that! But what about considering the specific topic of racism? Is it NON-racism? Is it ANTI-racism?"

Honestly, I have to say I hadn't thought about it in that way, but as I do – I must agree with her – the opposite of racism is ANTI-racism. It is something that we must palpably, physically and intellectually reject. We're all racists, if we're honest – and we can, we must resist, reject, act otherwise when the sin of racism rears its ugly head in our lives.

So that's what I'm encouraging this week. The actual RESISTANCE to racism – not just "thinking" we're trying not to be, but considering in our own heads what we, as individuals must do to REJECT and go AGAINST racism. Because it will continue to reappear, and we must be armed to reject it!

Also, in this mix is something I posted on Facebook this week....

"Good cops now know how good priests feel..."

The loneliness that we both feel in this crazy world of police brutality and sexual scandal is palpably painful. It makes it less so to know that people care, support, love, pray and believe in the good policemen and women, and the good priests.






